

For Directive 2011/65/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council of 8 June 2011 on the restriction of use of certain hazardous substances in electrical and electronic equipment.

The directive 2011/65/EC defines six (6) substances which are to be restricted. The maximum concentration by weight for each substance is listed below.

Substance	Maximum Concentration <sup>1</sup>
Lead (Pb)	0.1% <sup>2</sup>
Mercury (Hg)	0.1%
Cadmium (Cd)	0.01%
Hexavalent Chromium (Cr VI)	0.1%
Polybrominated biphenyls (PBB)	0.1%
Polybrominated diphenyl ethers (PBDE)	0.1%

<sup>1</sup>Restricted substances and maximum concentration values tolerated by weight in homogeneous materials

<sup>2</sup>Exemption 6(a) Lead as an alloying element in steel for machining purposes and in galvanized steel containing up to 0.35 % lead by weight; Exemption 6(b) Lead as an alloying element in aluminum containing up to 0.4 % lead by weight; Exemption 6(c) Copper alloy containing up to 4 % lead by weight; and Exemption 7(c)-I Electrical and electronic components containing lead in a glass or ceramic other than dielectric ceramic in capacitors, e.g. piezoelectronic devices, or in a glass or ceramic matrix compound.
